WHAT HAS BEEN DONE?

The first intellectual Output in the PAST-TIMES PROJECT is Digital & Social Media Production and Management Curriculum. The partnership created a draft of media-rich, mini-learning-format resources based on 6 modules which comprise 4 short learning units. Modules are focused on harnessing the potential of the most widely available and used technology products like smart-phones, tablets, etc. to develop digital and social media production and management skills which are necessary for recording audio and video sessions.

The second Intellectual Output of the Project is Oral history curriculum and resource pack. Partnership paid a lot of attention to this part of project because of historical importance and sentimental side of everyday memories of each people, in particular to collecting and protecting those stories from disappearance. Main idea of IO2 is to produce an innovative embedded learning programme with appropriate digital and social media publication and archiving guidelines to support the recording and publishing of oral history sessions in today's media focused world.



INTELLECTUAL OUTPUTS OF PAST- TIMES PROJECT

IO1: DIGITAL & SOCIAL MEDIA PRODUCTION AND MENEAGEMENT CURRICULUM

PAST-TIMES will produce a completely new modular Curriculum focused on building a suite of digital and social media production and management competences using the most common mobile technology devices. During the training young migrants will develop a set of skills which can be used to record audio and video sessions with seniors to collect their stories, tales and customs in a cost-effective way.

IO2: ORAL HISTORY CURRICULUM AND RESOURCE PACK

PAST-TIMES will collect and preserve memories and stories of living people's testimony about their own experiences for future use. The Curriculum will be addressed to the active retired target group that comprises an oral history appreciation training programme and to the young migrants that address best practice in developing an oral history exercise; recording oral history and archiving materials.

IO3: IN-SERVICE TRAINING PROGRAMME AND HANDBOOK

Partnership will develop a bespoke In-service training Course and the learning content to train adult educators and migrant support workers to develop the necessary skills and attributes and to support the integration of young migrants and seniors. Whole Course will comprise 50 hours of training (workshop, face-to-face training programme and self-directed learning) and it will be available as a hand-book and as a flip-book for online use.

IO4: WEBQUEST DEVELOPMENT AND LIBRARY

PAST-TIMES will produce 16 different WebQuests' challenges focused on issues related to culture, tradition, history or heritage and will seek to elucidate for the young migrant target group the richness of European life in the 20th Century. Answering on a challenge-based WebQuests, learners must process the information in meaningful ways and reach moral and ethical decisions guided by facts using teamwork collaboration, imagination and problem-solving skills.

IO5: ONLINE LEARNING PORTAL

An online platform going to be developed through which adult educators can access the in-service training programme resources. The e-learning portal will have all the social media features and will include specific collaboration areas for the tutors engaged in the project so that they can share their experience both locally and transnationally.

2nd TRANSNATIONAL PROJECT MEETING IN FRANCE

MEETING IN PARIS, FRANCE

The second meeting of the “PAST-TIMES” PROJECT took place in Paris, France on 15th and 16th of April 2019. The meeting has been hosted by Association E-Seniors (ESE).

Following the usual schedule, the general introductions and greetings were followed by a short review of the project – outputs, objectives, schedule and methodology.

Partners discussed among others the value proposition and developed modules of IO1: Digital & social media production and management curriculum and IO2: Oral history curriculum and resource pack. Next, partners presented a draft WebQuests workshop comprising IO4 of the project. Partners introduce and agreed the functionality of e-learning platform, belongs to IO5.

The second day of the meeting, was focused on discussing dissemination activities, administration, management and technical issues of the project. The meeting was completed with clear vision of future tasks and agreement of essential deadlines according to each partner’s responsibilities.
