Migrants trying to find a better life in the foreign country often encounter different kind of barriers. First one concerns labour market. Of course it is possible for them to find a job (even if low payable one) or live on financial support if they cannot find one. It's getting way harder if their want to work in field they specialize in – yet they don't have sufficient language skills or connections.

Those and more different kind of barriers are common problem when it comes to migrants adapting to new reality. They need more time to adjust and a different, complex and more patient approach, which they can find in contacts with older people in society. The PAST-TIMES PROJECT helps young migrants to meet seniors from their host country and to develop an appreciation of their own heritage and of the cultural heritage of their host country in Europe. During the next months we are going to:


- Continue working on bespoke media production training programme for young migrants
